“In Radio” is a project where low budget (community) Web radio broadcasting is used as a tool of youth participation and social inclusion. It will provide 2 main activities, an advance planning visit (APV) and a youth exchange (YE). Both activities will be held in Cluj-Napoca, Romania: the APV during January 10-13, 2019, (travel days included) and the YE between March 8-16, 2019 (including travel days).

The project involves youth organizations from Italy, Romania, Lithuania, Poland and Portugal some of them with great experience in inclusion of disabled young people, others experienced in ICT and knowhow in community web radio.



InRadio project objectives:

- Eliminate barriers between disabled youngsters and their non-disabled peers, between youth in general and the “world of adults and between visually impaired youngsters (VIP) and the rest of the community;
- Develop and enhance self-esteem, confidence and more capabilities of independent living. Throughout the YE and all over the project, participants will learn to work in teams, to help each other and to manage a variety of tasks. Thus, all participants, especially the VIPs will develop and enhance more self-esteem and confidence in their own capabilities of independent living;
- Non-VIP youngsters will become ambassadors of their disabled peers throughout their organization, community and the whole world. Non-VIP participants will be given the opportunity to learn about expectations, hopes and challenges that their VIP peers are facing and to facilitate a better understanding of these, throughout the entire society;

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- Learn the very basics of creating and maintaining an inclusive community Internet radio station. Participants will raise, in a non-formal and inclusive learning environment, their chances of employability and their abilities regarding their sense of entrepreneurship. They will experience democracy and dialogue in creating their own schedule, their own programs, shows, jingles and advertisements;
- Increase participant's chances on the labor market by developing skills and knowledge in searching for jobs, creating a CV, a motivation letter and attend a job interview, sessions;
- Strengthen the capacity to influence the society in which participants live. They will be empowered to use innovative tools, like the Internet radio to raise their voices in the community, on local and international level.

All project activities are based on non-formal education methods and tools, encourage active participation in all the sessions. The whole learning methodology will be adapted to the needs of all the participants and will be inclusive with regard of the disabled ones. Facilitators will choose those methods and tools, which involve equally and actively each participant.



Participants: The YE will gather a mixed group of 30 youngster age 18-30 (6 from each country), 15 blind / visually impaired (VI) and 15 non-disabled (non-VI).

In order to maintain a nationality-balanced group of participants, the 2 Romanian partners will select together a total of 6 youngsters, a youth leader and an accompanying person, for the Romanian group.

The profile of young participants:

- VI or non-VI, actively involved in one of the partner organizations or in the local community;
- Interest in ICT and in developing and maintaining Internet Radio programs;
- Highly motivated to develop specific skills in the field of social inclusion, youth participation and communication and to use them on personal and (future) professional level;
- Actively involvement in all stages of the project and eager to disseminate its results;
- Ready to attend all the activities of the YE.
- One VI youngster from each partner had also attended the advance-planning visit in January;

Each national group will have a group leader, age 18+, that is:

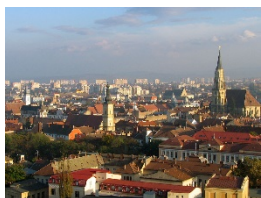
- Active in one of the partner organizations and experienced as a leader;
- Interested in developing competences regarding social inclusion and ICT;
- Able to use English as working language.
- Willing to disseminate the results on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Instagram, etc.

Each national group will have an English speaking accompanying person, 18+, experienced in guiding VI youngsters.

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The venue for both main activities is Cluj-Napoca, a city of lights, a city of the future, always different, always unpredictable, proudly flaunting its cultural and artistic diversity, a city that does not cease to amaze. Hidden in the heart of Transylvania, the Cluj-Napoca is the kind of place you cannot help falling in love with. The huge progress made in the last decades, as well as its ability to keep its traditions and local charm alive, stand as proof that Cluj-Napoca deserves its honorable spot along other European locations, such as Prague, Vienna and Berlin.

With a rich, complex history and legends, which make it the dream destination for mystery lovers, the Transylvanian city shows an interesting evolution over the centuries, which contributes to the diversity and multiculturalism that characterizes it today.

Attested for the first time almost 2000 years ago, the city became an important Roman colony. The settlement, known then by the name of Napoca, survives the Dark Ages of the migrations and reappears in annals in 1173, to be devastated, just a century later, by the Tatars.

In 1918, as Transylvania becomes part of Romania, Cluj is a prosperous, modern settlement that continues its development throughout the interwar period. The city receives the name it bears today, Cluj-Napoca, in 1974.

The Transylvanian city is currently in a constant state of improvement, adopting European values and practices and proving that it deserves all the appreciation it has gained. With more than 300.000 inhabitants and over 100.000 students, Cluj-Napoca has the biggest University in Romania.



Travel reimbursement: According to the rules within the **Erasmus+ Programme**, financed by the European Union, we will reimburse the travel costs on basis of the cheapest and most effective possibilities, 2nd class railway tickets, APEX-flights etc., accompanied by the receipt of complete and original tickets, invoices, bills, receipts, boarding cards etc.

All the travel tickets have to be bought after receiving confirmation from the coordinator!

Participants are expected to arrive to Cluj-Napoca, Romania on 8th of March 2019. The departure will be on 16th of March 2019, after breakfast. In case some participants want to spend 1-2 extra days in Romania, prior to, or after the event, we need to consult it with our National Agency. For any advice on that, do not hesitate to contact us. We cannot offer accommodation for these extra days.



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We will reimburse travel costs, by bank transfer, within 45 days after receiving all the original travel documents, after dissemination and filling out the Mobility Tool questionnaire sent by the European Union. The maximum reimbursements can not exceed:

- Italy 275 Euro;
- Lithuania 275 Euro;
- Poland 275 Euro;
- Portugal 360 Euro;
- Romania 0 Euro;
